History of the Department

The Department of Sanskrit was established in 2008, initially offering a General Course, with the Honours Course introduced in 2010 for Undergraduate students. Initially following an annual system of learning, the department transitioned to the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2018, while also incorporating the Choice Based Credit Framework (CCF) structure in alignment with University guidelines from 2023.

In addition to the Sanskrit Honours program, the Department offers Sanskrit as a General subject within various Honours courses, such as Geography, History, and Education. This strategic inclusion highlights the department's commitment to promoting interdisciplinary integration of Sanskrit within the broader academic context.

The department has five dedicated faculty members who introduce students to various aspects of Sanskrit studies. Apart from classroom teaching, the department engages its students in various teaching-learning activities in the form of seminars and webinars, wall magazines, and so on to pique their interest. Uniqueness of the Department

The faculty members of the department share a unified vision regarding the career advancement and psychological development of students. The department is dedicated to standing as a one-stop solution for its students, including the passed-out fellows. It extends help to any affordable degree for the academic perseverance of the students. Emphasizing the development of rational thinking, the department aims to connect students with India's socioeconomic and cultural heritage through a critical study of the Indian Knowledge System.

The students are given the opportunity to know the language very systematically. They are also encouraged to use Sanskrit as a spoken language. Special reading sessions are arranged where students are taught to read and recite Sanskrit texts with ease. The department is also dedicated to helping the ex-students pursue higher studies in any possible manner.

For the last three to four years, the number of students admitted to the college has decreased. It has a big impact on the Sanskrit department as well. Accepting this challenge, we have to try to make the students college-oriented. Introduction of new add-on courses and job-oriented courses can solve this problem. There is optimism that the implementation of NEP, 2020 will bring about positive change.

Future Plan

1. The department looks forward to introducing more Add-on courses for the students.
2. It also plans to make students more aware of the MOOC (SWAYAM) courses and expects a higher number of students enrolling in the courses.
3. More emphasis is to be given to the usage of audio-visual content for teaching the students.
4. Introduce PG programme in Sanskrit.
5. Create more awareness among students about IKS
6. Set up a Language Lab.
7. Develop a Departmental Library.
8. Increase the number of extended lectures, Seminars and Webinars.
